Antitrust / Competition

- *In re Diisocyanates Antitrust Litigation* – Stephanie represents a class of direct purchaser plaintiffs in this multidistrict litigation located in the Western District of Pennsylvania. Plaintiffs allege price-fixing by the leading manufacturers of methylene diphenyl diisocyanate (“MDI”) and toluene diisocyanate (“TDI”), which are chemical components used to make polyurethane plastics. Hausfeld was appointed interim co-lead counsel in this action.
- *In re Generic Drugs Antitrust Litigation* – Stephanie represents a class of end-payer plaintiffs in this multidistrict litigation in the Eastern District of Pennsylvania. Plaintiffs allege that manufacturers and/or distributors of generic drugs engaged in an industry-wide conspiracy to fix prices of generic drugs sold in the United States. The case is in the early stages of discovery.

Civil and Human Rights

- *Roy Samathanam, et.al v. Gotabaya Rajapaksa* – Stephanie also represents victims of torture in a civil lawsuit against former Defense Secretary of Sri Lanka, Gotabaya Rajapaksa. Through legal doctrines such as command responsibility, agency, and conspiracy, Plaintiffs allege that the defendant violated the Torture Victim Protection Act and California tort law. This case is being litigated in the Central District of California.
